Describe activity <small>(Case presentation, article review, poster presentation, conference presentation, teaching session, etc.)</small>
This activity was a one on one review session with the BSW EP rep, reviewing a difficult atrial flutter case from the prior week.

What did you learn
I was able to go through a lot of Carto V6 features in depth and explore possible reasons why the case had been difficult, and what could be done to prevent this happening in the future. I was able to then develop step-by-step procedural document for mapping of atrial flutter including the correct order to respond to certain events, and what the various software lock-outs are and how to overcome them. I learned primarily how the algorithm for wave-front detection relies on a background unipolar signal, and how noise on this signal can cause problems with map creation.

How will you apply this to your practice
I now know several steps I can take to ensure a smoother point collection. I have made a pre-procedure checklist of settings to check, turn on or off or adjust to ensure the software will give an accurate representation of the activation of atrial flutter.
